
My Pet Rat, by Ellie

My Pet Jumping Spiders, by Chris Willingham, 7



• It might take up to 12 years for a large type of spider to become an adult.


Spiders aren't as gross as you think they are. In fact, they're very inis my favoirte one, but I don't hold him. John is brown with a stripe on his back. He is nice.
