
Descendants of Samuel Souther, Sr. (Green Line)

1. Samuel' **SOUTHER** Sr.; b. 17 Sep 1787 in Concord, New Hampshire;^{1,2,3} m. Mary **WEBSTER**, daughter of John **WEBSTER** and Mary **STERLING**, 1809 in Maine;^{4,5} d. 9 Jan 1856 in Fryeburg, Maine, at age 68.^{6,7}

Samuel carried on his trade as Hatter until he opened the "Temperance House," a large colonial house on Portland Street. On his death, his son, John Webster **SOUTHER** occupied it until the early 1870s when it was sold to George H. **ABBOTT**.

Samuel and his wife and children, Sarah and Thomas are buried in Pine Grove Cemetery, Section 2, Lot 102, Fryeburg, Maine.

Mary **WEBSTER** was born on 26 Aug 1789.^{8,9} She died on 12 Jul 1856 in Fryeburg, Maine, at age 66.^{10,11}

The six known children of Samuel' **SOUTHER** Sr. and Mary **WEBSTER** were as follows:

- i. Mary² **SOUTHER;** b. circa 1813. Mary died in infancy.
- ii. John Webster SOUTHER, b. 28 Apr 1815 in Fryeburg, Maine; m. Kerenhappuck CAMERON.
 - iii. Thomas SOUTHER; b. 12 Jul 1816 in Fryeburg, Maine;¹² d. 23 May 1856 in Fryeburg, Maine, at age 39.^{13,14} Thomas represented Fryeburg as a member of the Oxford County Agricultural Society. He was a graduate of Dartmouth.

- 3 iv. Samuel L. SOUTHER Jr, b. 26 Feb 1819 in Fryeburg, Maine; m. Mary Francis TOWLE.
- 4 v. Georgianna **SOUTHER**, b. 26 Feb 1828 in Oxford, Grafton, New Hampshire; m. George Bradley **BARROWS**.
 - vi. Sarah **SOUTHER**; b. May 1859;¹⁵ d. 27 Aug 1860 at age 1.¹⁶ (I'm not so positive this is a child of Samuel and Mary the birth is after the father has passed away).

Generation Two

2. John Webster² SOUTHER (*Samuel*¹); b. 28 Apr 1815 in Fryeburg, Maine;¹⁷ m. Kerenhappuck CAMERON, daughter of Judge CAMERON, 21 Jan 1843 in Fryeburg, Maine;¹⁸ d. 12 Nov 1878 at age 63.¹⁹ In a document found in the Maine Historical Society in Portland, Maine, describes John W. SOUTHER of Fryburg taking on a 14 year old pauper boy of Portland as an farmer apprentice. The document reads in part:

".....do put, place and bind out John **SMITH** chargable as a Pauper in Portland as an Apprentice to John W. **SOUTHER** of Fryburgh to learn the art, trade or mystery of a Farmer, the said John after the manner of an Apprentice, to dwell with and serve the said **SOUTHER** from the day of the date hereof, until the fourteenth day of May, which willbe in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, at which time the said apprentice, if he be living, will be twenty one years of age.

And for the said **SOUTHER** on his part, doth hereby promise, covenant, and agree to teach and instruct the said apprentice, or cause him to be taught and instructed in the art, trade or calling of a Farmer by the best way or means he can; and also to teach and instruct the said apprentice, or cause him to be taught and instructed, to read and write and cypher if the said appentice be capable to learn; and shall well and faithfully find and provide for the said apprentice, good and sufficient meat, drink, clothing, lodging and other necessaries fit and convenient for such an apprentice, during the term aforesaid, and at tht expiration thereof, shall give unto the said apprentice, two suits of new wearing apparel, one suitable for Lord's days and the other for working days and fifty dollars in money.

In Testimony Whereof, the said parties have hereunto interchangeable set their hands and seals, the ninth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one......"

It can be assumed that this John **SMITH** was born on 14 May 1837.

John, his wife and children: Harriet, Lucius and Thomas are buried in Pine Grove Cemetery, Section 2, Lot 102, Fryeburg, Maine.

Kerenhappuck **CAMERON** was born on 28 Nov 1820.²⁰ She died on 8 Jan 1896 in Maine at age 75.²¹ She was also known as Kerenhaffauch **CAMERON**. She was also known as Katherine **CAMERON**. The seven known children of John Webster² **SOUTHER** and Kerenhappuck **CAMERON** were as follows:

- Marianna SOUTHER; b. 20 Dec 1845 in Fryeburg, Maine;²⁴ m. John W. ODLIN, son of Woodbridge ODLIN and Abby P. COMSTOCK, Dec 1867 in Fryeburg, Maine;²⁵ d. 1871 in Concord, New Hampshire.²⁶ Mariana and John had a son who died in infancy.
- iii. Susan Chase SOUTHER; b. 4 Dec 1847 in Fryeburg, Maine;²⁷ m. Caleb A. Samuel was a graduate of Dartmouth College and Bangor Theological Seminary and for a time was pastor of the Congregational Church at Belfast, Maine. Prior to his enlistment, he was a Chaplain of the Penal and Charitable Institutions of Worcester, MA. He also served in the General Court and was much respected and loved.



A centennial celebration of the settlement of Fryeburg and neighborhood took place 20 Aug 1863. Among the many speakers was Reverend Samuel **SOUTHER**, a native of Fryeburg, now living in Worcester. He delivered a historical address at that celebration.

Samuel can be found attending the funeral of a 17 month old child, who had died of cholera infantum; Henry A. **HILTON** at Belfast, Maine on 23 Aug 1848. He had been standing in for Reverend Edward F. **CUTTER**.

Samuel enlisted as a Private of the Civil War on 25 Nov 1863, mustered 4 Jan 1864. He was the Chaplain of the 57th Regiment of the Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry in the War of the Rebellion and was killed by a shell at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia on 6 May 1864. He was by then, a 1st Sergeant in Company B.

Samuel was a man of high personal character and a devoted Christian of strong

religious convictions which he consistently maintained and he never allowed anything to interfer with his religious duties. He believed it to be his Christian duty to enlist in the army for the defense of his country and sealed his devotion to it by his blood. He was a noble, honorable and true-hearted man.

In Memory of REVEREND SAMUEL SOUTHER Who Fell in the Battle of the Wilderness May 6th, 1864.

He laid his civic honors down. And girded for the fight, Careless of place or high renown. But zealous for the right.	The Battle of the Wilderness, 'Twas there he, fighting, fell; And still is there his resting-place, But the spot there's none to tell.
He asked not sword or shoulder-	No sepulture by mortal hands

Rev. Samuel Souther, a native of Fryeburg, Me., graduate of Dartmouth, 1842, and of the Bangor Theological Seminary, came to Worcester in 1857 and became city missionary and chaplain at the jail and insane asylum. He had previously been minister of the Congregational Church at Belfast, Me., and agent of the American Sunday School Union. In 1863-4, he was representative from this city. He was indefatigable in the work of enlisting men for the service, speaking at war meetings, before and after his own enlistment in the 57th, in which he served as sergeant. He was killed in the Wilderness and his body was never found.

Testament of Reverend Samuel Souther & family for support of John Brown

It is the Second of December 1859. The hour is quarter to Twelve, the time appointed for The Execution of John Brown.

For near two hours the tolling of the Bells has been speaking our sorrow, our horror at the deed.

This record is made to keep alive the memory of the count & to deeper in our hearts the loathing we feel towards that hateful system of oppression & iniquity American Slavery

And here we pledge to one another before our God who hath taught us to do justly and love mercy as well as to walk humbly before him, over undying sympathy for the oppressed. We will endeavor henceforth to remember these in bonds as bound with them and will do everything in our power to secure to them the rights which God confess upon every rational human being, the right to life, Liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

This we promise. God help us to perform it.

Mary Francis **TOWLE** was born on 9 Aug 1825 in Fryeburg, Maine.^{40,41} She died on 28 Feb 1926 in Cleveland, Cuyahuga, Ohio, at age 100.^{42,43} Mary can be found as member #79508 of the Daughters of the American Revolution in lineage book Volume 80, p. 184 as being the great grand-daughter of Private Simeon **TOWLE** who served in Captain Henry **ELKIN**'s company, 1775, stationed at Pierce's Island. He signed the Association Text, 1776, in Hampton, NH where he was born.

Willis K. **HEATH**, a 23 year old Clerk at a Wire Mill, born in Maine; Richard W. **GREEN**, an 18 year old student born in Maine and a 23 year old servant, Margaret **McPATTLAND**, born in Ireland were recorded as living with Mary and three of her children when the 1880 Federal Census for Massachusetts was enumerated.

In an undated (what appears to be from a Cleveland newspaper) is a clipping of an obituary:

"MARY FRANCES (TOWLE) SOUTHER

Mary Frances (Towle) **SOUTHER**, daughter of Dr. Ira and Mrs. **TOWLE** of Fryeburg and wife of the late Samuel **SOUTHER** of Worcester, Mass., died in Cleveland, Ohio, February 28, after a long period of infirmity from pneumonia. The funeral and burial was in Lake View Cemetery Cleveland, Tuesday March 1.

Mrs. **SOUTHER**, though a native of Fryeburg, and for sometime after her marriage to Rev. Samuel **SOUTHER**, a resident of Fryeburg Village, will be known to few persons of the present in that locality as the greater part of her

life was spent in Worcester, Mass. Three sons and three daughters were born to Mr. and Mrs. **SOUTHER** and only the oldest daughter, Mrs. Annie B. S. **CHANDLER**, survives, now living in Pomfret Centre with her son. A number of grandchildren are living in different places.

Rev. Samuel **SOUTHER**, son of Samuel and Mary (**WEBSTER**) **SOUTHER** of Fryeburg, a graduate of Dartmouth College, '42 and of Bangor Theological Seminary, went from Worcester into the United States Volunteers in 1863, and was lost in the Battle of the Wilderness, May 6, 1864. Mrs. **SOUTHER** continued to live in Worcester and brought up her children to useful service and prosperous lives. Her declining years were spent in Cleveland with her son, John I. **SOUTHER**, and her daughter, Mrs. Abbie C. F. S. **FULLER**, during their lives. Since their deaths Mrs. **SOUTHER** has been an invalid, but retained her mental powers to a remarkable degree of ability. A thorough student and a wide an intelligent reader, Mrs. **SOUTHER** early inspired her children with the importance of education, and she lived to see them all fortunate in the possession. Mrs. **SOUTHER** was always interested in current affairs, but found time during the later years of her life to engage in literary work for her own information and amusement, writing a *History of England*, among other works of a literary nature.

Mrs. **SOUTHER** was always a loyal daughter of Fryeburg and visited the ancestral home and near relatives almost every summer during the youth of her children; visiting her brother Dr. William C. **TOWLE**; her sister, Mrs. Abby **WARRINER**; and her husband's brother and sister, John W. **SOUTHER**, and Mrs. Georgianna S. **BARROWS**.

In Fryeburg she was often joined by her younger sister, Mrs. A. S. **BRADLEY** of Chicago, who survives her, now living with her daughter, Mrs. W. W. **ATWOOD** of Worcester. Mrs. **SOUTHER** always enjoyed the reunions with her sister Abby and her sister-in-law Georgianna, and they being of near ages and of active minds and bodies, were known among themselves, and so recoggnized by the members of their families as "The Southers Three." Mrs. **SOUTHER** was the last survivor of this trio for many years. Passing away at the advanced age of 101 years and several months, her last annivaersary being August 9, 1926. She had out-lived all her associates and will be remembered by only a few of the generations since.

viii. John Ira SOUTHER, b. 25 Feb 1861 in Worcester, Massachusetts; m. Kate Amelia FULLER.
 ix. Mary F. SOUTHER; b. circa 1864 in Belfast, Waldo, Maine.⁵² Mary died in infancy.

4. Georgianna² **SOUTHER** (*Samuel*¹); b. 26 Feb 1828 in Oxford, Grafton, New Hampshire;⁵³ m. George Bradley **BARROWS**, son of John Stuart **BARROWS** Esq., 12 Jun 1855 in Fryeburg, Maine;^{54,55} d. 8 Feb 1914 in Fryeburg, Maine, at age 85.⁵⁶ Georgianna and George's marriage was recorded in Boston, Massachusetts.

She was an instructor at the Freehold Young Ladies' Seminary, Freehold, New Jersey. She is listed in the school catalogs as Georgianna **SOUTHER**, an English teacher for the years 1845 to 1847, and for 1852 to 1853. Her brother, Thomas was principal of the Freehold Academy in 1848.

Georgianna, her husband and their children are all buried in Pine Grove Cemetery, Section 2, Lot 118 in Fryeburg, Maine.

George Bradley **BARROWS** was born on 22 Dec 1822.⁵⁷ He died on 29 Jan 1904 at age 81.⁵⁸ The four known children of Georgianna² **SOUTHER** and George Bradley **BARROWS** were as follows:

- i. Grace³ **BARROWS;** b. 22 Apr 1856;⁵⁹ d. 16 Dec 1861 at age 5.⁶⁰
- ii. Anna **BARROWS;** b. 24 May 1861;⁶¹ d. 11 Feb 1948 at age 86.⁶²

5. John Cameron³ **SOUTHER** (*John Webster*², *Samuel*¹); b. 4 Aug 1850 in Fryeburg, Maine;⁶⁷ m. Isabella M. **CRAWFORD**, daughter of Mariah **WEST**, 16 May 1876 in Cambridge, Massachusetts.⁶⁸

Isabella M. **CRAWFORD** was born in Aug 1856 in Halifax, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada.^{69,70} She died on 26 Sep 1938 in Boston, Massachusetts, at age 82.⁷¹ In 1900, Isabella was residing at 151 West Canton Street, in Boston with Lodger, Susan W. **ADAMS**. Isabella was a Non-Resident.

The informant for Isabella's death was Edw. A. **RICHARDSON**, a cousin.

The only known child of John Cameron³ **SOUTHER** and Isabella M. **CRAWFORD** was:

William **Souther**, one of the best known of the old settlers of western Nebraska, is a business man of more than ordinary capacity. He has conducted numerous large enterprises during his career and is possessed of wide experience and a character of the highest integrity. He has done a great deal toward making the town of Crawford what it is today, aiding in every manner possible in promoting its commercial development and is one of the solid and substantial citizens of Dawes county.

Mr. Souther was born in Fryeburg, Maine, in 1854 of old American stock, his father having been John W. Souther, a lumberman of that country and his mother Miss Katherine Cameron from Vermont. Our subject grew up in his native state as a young man attending Bowdoin College for some time at Brunswick, Maine and is an alumnus of the different literary societies there. After completing his education he went into the lumber woods of Maine where he spent ten years, also did farming and for a year was in the Wisconsin lumber districts. In the spring of 1883 he went west to Oregon and Washington, where he engaged in the sheep business and spent three years in that region. In the spring of 1886 he became superintendent for the New Hampshire Cattle Company and ranched with them up to 1893, this being all cattle business. He next became interested in the mercantile business in Crawford and also in Lusk, Wyoming and while at the latter place was in Partnership with John H. Barron, the two building a syndicate block in Crawford and lost a large amount of money, then for a time Mr. Souther was associated with the firm of *Pratt & Ferris*, a large cattle concern with headquarters at Big Red, Wyoming and at the same time was interested in the sheep business in that state. Mr. Souther has made Crawford his home town more or less ever since coming west and that city claims him as one of their leading men. He has a large ranch near Crawford, one thousand three

hundred and forty acres with nearly five hundred of it under irrigation and on this place he feeds a large number of cattle each year. Besides his different enterprises in the west, including a wheat farm in North Dakota, Mr. **Souther** has large lumbering interests in Maine which net him considerable property.

In 1892, Mr. **Souther** was married to Miss Mabel Graham **MacIntosh** of Ypsilanti, Michigan. Mrs. **Souther** is a daughter of Charles **MacIntosh**, a carriage maker there. To Mr. and Mrs. **Souther** have been born the following children: John Barron, Susan Page, Grace and Mabel.

Mr. **Souther** is a strong Republican, active in party politics.⁷⁵

Mabel Graham **MacINTOSH** was born in Aug 1864 in Michigan.⁷⁶

Dr. William Towle **SOUTHER** aged 71 years, 11 months and 14 days, a prominent physician and surgeon in Worcester for years died at 7 a.m. today in his home, 22 Auburn Street. Death was due to pneumonia. He had been confined to his bed since Saturday.

He was born in Belfast, ME, March 7, 1850, the son of Reverend Samuel T. SOUTHER and Mary Francis TOWLE.

The latter is still living in Cleveland, OH at the advanced age of 96 years.

The **SOUTHER** family came to Worcester when Dr. **SOUTHER** was only seven years of age. He graduated from Classical High School and then entered Yale University. He graduated with the degree of A.B. in 1873. After acting as Principal at the Grafton High School for one year he went to Harvard Medical School where he graduated in 1877. He spent a year in the Boston City Hospital.

Dr. **SOUTHER** began to practice of medicine in Worcester in March 1878, his first office being located in the Old Salisbury Mansion at Lincoln Square. He first began to make his calls about the city on horseback.

Dr. **SOUTHER** was particularly interested in educational matters. He was a Republican and was elected as a member of the school committee, ward 1, in 1884. He served faithfully for years on the school committee, being the chairman of the committee at the dedication of the English high school building which is known as the Classical High.

Dr. **SOUTHER** retired from active practice about 15 years ago. He was a great reader, being a devotee of **SCOTT** and **DICKENS** and was also fond of music, having been connected with the Worcester Festival chorus for many years.

He became a fellow of the Massachusetts Medical Society in 1877 and was active in the Hancock club in Worcester before the club was disbanded.

He was a member of the Central Congregational church; Athelstan Lodge, A.F. & A.M.; Regulus Lodge, Knights of Pythias; Redgley Lodge, International Order of Odd Fellows.

Dr. **SOUTHER** was united in marriage, October 5, 1887 to Elizabeth **NEWLAND** of Worcester who survives. Other survivors are three daughters; Mrs. Frederick W. **HASKELL**. Elizabeth and Gertrude **SOUTHER**; three grandchildren, Frederick, Mary and Anne **HASKELL** all of Worcester. Two sisters; Mrs. William E. **CHANDLER** of Prince Bay, NY and Mrs. Gail S. **FULLER** of Cleveland, OH."

William and Elizabeth and their three daughters and son-in-law, Frederick W. **HASKELL** are all buried in the Rural Cemetery, Worcester, MA. In the same Lot are members of the **DICKINSON** and **NEWLAND** family.

Elizabeth E. **NEWLAND** was born on 6 Apr 1864 in Worcester, Massachusetts.¹⁰⁵ She died on 9 Jun 1929 in Shrewsbury, Worcester, Massachusetts, at age 65.¹⁰⁶ Elizabeth was buried in Worcester on 11 Jun 1929. The informant for her death was her daughter, Mrs. Christine **HASKELL**.

The three known children of William Towle³ **SOUTHER** and Elizabeth E. **NEWLAND** all b. in Worcester, Massachusetts, were as follows:

Memorial exercises in honor of Miss Gertrude **SOUTHER**, a former member of the faculty, were conducted yesterday morning in the presence of the entire study body of Classical High School in the school auditorium. Miss **SOUTHER** taught at Classical for 11 years. In recent years she has spent the winter in the South, and it was while returning to Worcester recently that she passed away.

The school orchestra presented a program and Miss Sarah SIGEL, class pianist, gave several selections. Miss Maude **DODGE** spoke on her connections with Miss **SOUTHER**, both in private and school life. Perry S. **HOWE**, another member of the faculty, told of Miss **SOUTHER**'s connections with the school. A two-minute period of silence was observed at the close of the session.

He received his education at the Thomas Street Grammar School, graduated with the class of 1878 from the Classical High School, studied for three years at Worcester Polytechnic Institute and received the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1884 at Yale College.

After teaching mathematics at the high school he became a chemist and was an expert analyzer for the Illinois Steel Company at Hurley, WI. He was assistant superintendent of the Chicago plant and was later superintendent of the Cambria Steel Company, Johnstown, PA.

He leaves his mother in Cleveland; three children, Mrs. Helen **HARTFORD**, Cleveland; Hugh S. **SOUTHER**, Hallsboro and Arthur **SOUTHER**, a student at Yale; two sisters Mrs. Willard **FULLER**, Cleveland and Mrs. William E. **CHANDLER**, New York and a brother, Dr. William T. **SOUTHER**, Worcester.
