

This fall we begin an emphasis on Christian formation and worship, guided by an ecumenical curriculum entitled "Seasons of the Spirit." The curriculum provides educational resources for all ages and incorporates the use of the common lectionary to connect our individual and communal experience within the witness of the larger church in worship, service and discovery. In our 9:45 a.m. classes, children, youth and adults will be engaging the biblical texts which relate to the emphasis in worship. All activities are meant to unite the body of Christ in God's full embrace and graciousness. Christian education is not just for kids and worship is not reserved for adults. Because God is never "done" with us, both activities are important for Christian formation at any age or stage of our lives!

Seasons of the Spirit is a collaborative effort by various educators, liturgists, pastors and musicians from various denominations in the United States and Canada, including the Discples of Christ. They offer more material than we can use on any given Sunday including helps in worship planning, music, liturgy, service projects and meditations. The staff and Congregational Care have worked in concert to map out our worship, education and music programs for the coming season. # Things you should know

**CPR/AED** - In late June, 5 members of our congregation were recertified in CPR/AED by Dr. Peggy Wilken at SIU. Those completing the 2 night course were Marge Schulhof, Bob Schulhof, Theresa Ullman, Dia Parr and Al Parr.

Did you know that if you have a sudden cardiac arrest that your chances of survival are:

- Less than 1% without treatment;
- With immediate CPR your
- chances increase to 5%-12%
- But with the AED your chances of survival increases to 40%

We are very fortunate that we at First Christian have an AED and trained members to use it so that our congregation may benefit from this life saving service.

We will have a demonstration of the use of AEDs by Dr.Peggy Wilken in the near future-WATCH FOR THE ANNOUNCEMENT ON THE HOT LINE AND IN THE FCC WEEKLY.



**FLU SHOT CLINIC**, by Jackson County Health Department, Thursday, October 16th from 4:30 pm until 6:00 pm in the narthex.

1.) Flu and pneumonia shots are available. Flu is \$20 and pneumonia is \$35—pneumonia shots are only needed one time if taken at or after age 65.

2.) Medicare is accepted but you must bring your Medicare Card and the proof of any supplement you have...please note that some supplements will not pay for the service.

3.) State of Illinois insurance will pay if:

- You are full time with the State
- You are retired from full time with the State
- You are the surviving spouse of a full time employee of the State
- Family members of full time State employees are not covered

4.) Vaccine will be available for children.

5.) Anyone in the community may receive this service at this time.

## What Paul Meant

Paul isn't such a bad guy! This is the opening argument of the newest book by the author of What Jesus Meant. In this new volume, *What Paul Meant,* Garry Wills examines the common conceptions of Paul as well as the overall message of Paul's writing in the proper context that they were to be received. In the end, Wills suggests that what Paul meant is the same as what Jesus meant: Love God and love your neighbor.

For centuries, Paul has been viewed by many scholars and Chris-

tians as being on the same pedestal as Judas Iscariot. Judas may have brought about the death of Christ's body, they say, but Paul brought about the death of his spirit. For many years, his letters have been regarded with gloom and negativity, often times being painted as misogyny and general hatred. His writings have been used as a bludgeon against women, gays, and Jews. Wills contends that those interpretations have been taken out of context, and when examined in their proper historical sense, illuminate a very different side of Paul that many of us have not known. Wills, for example, discusses at length the misconception that Paul felt that women should

be subservient to men. On the contrary, he suggests, Paul felt that women should be very active in the ministry. Wills then discusses several women, which are alluded to by Paul, as being very much leaders in their faith.

As a the reviewer for this book, I have struggled with the writings of Paul and have always approached his work with uneasiness. Wills' thoughtful and scholarly examination of the seven letters in the New Testament (those that can be directly attributed to Paul) will be spiritual brain food for those who enjoy surprises and discoveries on their journey of faith. We are so excited to unveil our brand-new Christian Ed program! We've made changes based on the input of our pastor, our parents and Christian education professionals. Some changes are still in the works, so stay tuned for all the ways we're are continuing to build on and improve our Young Disciples program!

#### **Our New Sunday School**

Starting Sept. 7, we will kick off our program with a new approach to Sunday School and a new earlier time. Come join us at 9:45 a.m. before worship for an exciting adventure into ancient Egypt as we continue learning about Moses and the Exodus.

All children ages 3-11 will begin the morning together in our creative arts room on the third floor, learning the story for the day in interactive ways and helping to tell it with costumes and props. Next, the children will break for activities and games related to the story.

Our Little Disciples, ages 3-6, will meet in the newly refurbished Little Disciples room for their activities under the direction of Megan Crowell and volunteers. Check out the great work Debra Whitledge has done in creating a Noah's Ark mural for that room! Our Exploring Disciples, ages 7-11, will rotate their activities between many learning centers: the craft room, the creative arts room, the youth room, and outdoors whenever possible. I will lead this class with assistance from volunteers.

Who are these volunteers you wonder? Glad you asked. Every parent and grandparent with children in the program will be invited to help out on an occasional basis. Also, we have wonderful volunteers who are or were educators to help us as well! We would like to ensure that there are two responsible caregivers with every group of children for everyone's safety. This model also allows for everyone to have an opportunity to participate and no one to have to shoulder the weekly responsibility of a Sunday School class, which is important for a congregation as busy as we are!

#### **Our New Nursery**

Children ages 0-2 have a brandnew nursery, thanks to the efforts of so many people! Come take a look at the results of a lot of hard work. And thank you to the many people who have donated money and time to this worthy cause. We still have fundraising to do to make up for some of the costs, so please consider helping us out by buying the Macy's coupons we're selling this month for \$5 or by making a donation. Nursery care will be available during both Sunday School and worship, and it will be staffed by a rotation of church mothers and grandmothers.

#### **Our New Worship Service**

Worship will change slightly to accommodate our kids, involving them more when and where we can. We will have plenty of activities available to keep younger children occupied during the service, and nursery care will be available for wiggle worms. Children will be assuming many roles throughout the worship service, including offering the opening prayer, reading scripture, serving as junior deacons, learning the sound board, providing music, etc. If there is a particular way to contribute to worship that your child might enjoy, please let me know.

#### **Our New Youth Programs**

Our program for Twelves and Teens is still under construction. In cooperation with all the parents for this age group, we are developing a program that will fit our kids best. Please know that this age group is a priority for us this year, and we will have the best program we can as soon as we can. Until further notice, Twelves and Teens are invited to join in learning with their parents in the adult Sunday School class or in assisting with younger children.
