"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times; it ws the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness; it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity; it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness; . . . "

- Charles Dickens from the Tale of Two Cities, 1859.

This is the season we become more familiar with Dickens from the magical tale of a Christmas Carol rather than the darker story of the French revolution. Yet, as I listen to the many stories of this particular Christmas season, I am reminded of these famous lines from the social activist, Charles Dickens.

Our Annual Congregational Meeting was the best of times but at a moment in our history when we fear we may be facing the worst of times. We have so much for which to be grateful and so many to whom we owe our gratitude. We are able to meet our overhead because of the generosity of our members past and present. Yet, we also realize shifts in culture and economic downtrends are changing the map of American culture and the church in every place is faced with some very challenging realities and we at FCC are no exception. It may seem a cruel irony but as costs rise, and the stock market plumets participation continues to decline in American congregations. Long established churches are closing their doors. Our supportive institutions like our colleges, seminaries and regional ministries are facing similar challenges. It seems we can no longer afford to take our Christianity, denominational or congregational life for granted.

And although shrinking populations and revenue's may seem the worst of times, perhaps there is opportunity as well. It may well be the best of times to be reshaped and reborn as we struggle out of the mold of culture's expectations and turn to the wisdom of God who might say to us, "That is fine for them but YOU are different – you have a unique story and a particular identity. Be true to whose you are."

Recently, one congregation provided an alternative to "Black Friday" so people could spend a day celebrating the meaning and purpose of the Christ in Christmas rather than just spending at the the mall. There were opportunities at church for fellowship, study and worship as well as service projects in the community and of course there was abundant hospitality. This church made such a radical statement with this program, they made the news! Imagine that! How radical is our proclamation? How will lives be transformed this Christmas by our story? For unto US a Child is born!

Congregational Meeting November 16, 2008

On Sunday, November 16, 2008, after the Thanksgiving Potluck, the congregation met for its annual Congregational Meeting. Al Parr, representing the Nominating Committee, presented the nominations for Trustee, Elders, and Deacons. Greg Whitledge, Facilities and Finance Avenue of Serve Leader, presented the 2009 General Operating Budget and Dia Parr, Board Chair presented a Memorandum of Understanding to the Minister's Contract for consideration. After the presentations, the congregation voted on each item by secret ballot. Jak Tichenor and Oval and Joyce Myers collected and counted the ballots.

A General Operating Budget for

2009 of \$162,385.00 was approved. This budget reflects a 3.3% increase over last year's budget. The budget is to be funded as follows: Pledges \$92,934.00 Unpledged Offering \$8,000.00 Interest Income from Old National Bank \$1,000.00 Transfer from the Garden Fund \$500.00 Transfer from the Managed Fund \$51,951.00

Because of the tight financial situation the congregation faces, no raises were offered to the personnel the congregation employees. Most of the increase in the budget is due to rising costs of utilities.

Personnel were instead given extra paid time away from the job. Marleen Shepherd and Mary Burnam were given four (4) personal days, one (1) per quarter. Derek Hamblin was given one (1) more emergency paid Sunday.

The following Memorandum of Understanding to the Minister's contract was also approved:

- Vacation time will be increased to twenty-five (25) days (five (5) weeks) per calendar year until such time as either party requests a change. Vacation time cannot accumulate from year to year. Although not required, it is suggested that one (1) vacation day be used per quarter for personal reflection time.
- 2. Eight (8) days of sick leave will be granted per calendar

year. Sick leave may be used at such time there is a need for doctor's appointments, personal illness, or illness in the immediate family. Immediate family includes spouse, children, grandchildren, or parents and parents-in-law. If more that eight (8) days of sick leave is needed for an extended illness, vacation time will be used.

- 3. As is current practice, Continuing Education released time will be one (1) week (5 days) per year. For time needed for Continuing Education beyond one (1) week, vacation time will be used.
- 4. For tax purposes, three thousand dollars (\$3000.00) will be moved from salary to housing allowance upon recommendation from the accountant.

Marleen Shepherd and Katherine Graves then recognized members of the congregation who have contributed time and energy to the life of the church in the past vear. Marleen awarded certificates to Debra Whitledge, Stephanie Graves and David Schremp, and Brice and Amy Dion for their work in Christian Education. Katherine Graves awarded certificates to Marcia Phelps, outgoing Trustee; Grace Hussey, Dia Parr, Jak Tichenor, and Tamara Workman, outgoing Elders; and Kathy Deutsch, Stephanie Graves, Ron Graves, Tom Kilpatrick, and Monica Tichenor, outgoing Deacons.

December Sunday School

Throughout November, children learned some of Jesus' most important teachings in Matthew, including the Golden Rule, the Beatitudes, the Parable of the 10 Bridesmaids and the Parable of the Talents. In December children will hear the Christmas story through the scriptures of Isaiah, Luke and Matthew, exploring themes such as Messengers of Hope, Birthing a Promise, Long-Awaited Gift & Another Road. In December, we will begin collecting offering during Sunday School to benefit Heifer International. Our goal will be to raise \$50 that will allow us to give a Basket of Hope. The Heifer Hope Basket includes chickens and rabbits.
