A new addition to the library since the last newsletter is Scrappy Quilts by M'Liss Rae Hawley. As most of you know, positions on the guild executive are 2 year appointments. This means that my tenure as librarian will end at the end of this guild year. I have spoken to each of the current library assistants and, for a variety of reasons, none of them feel able to take over as librarian for next year so we will need someone from our membership to assume this responsibility. Some of the current assistants will stay on and I will be available to assist the new librarian when needed. If you are interested in this position it would be beneficial for you to spend some time in the library with us over the next few months to become more familiar with the library and the procedures we follow.

There have been a lot of changes to the program calendar since it was originally published:

- The Brazilian Embroidery class has been cancelled, but Ann Scott has stepped up to the plate to offer a two-night smocking workshop on Feb. 17 and March 10. She's still mulling over ideas, but it will likely involve making a baby bonnet, with her supplying the pregathered fabric for a nominal fee. See Susan to sign up.
- Juliet McDonald will be demonstrating the construction of a chatelaine for Quilts on the Rocks participants on April 28. The \$2 registration fee includes a kit to make your chatelaine.
- Daintry's workshop on quilt labelling & documenting, originally scheduled for January 13, was cancelled due to weather. It has been rescheduled for Feb. 17.
- We have also switched Myrna's fabric postcard workshop with Patti's hand piecing demonstration to allow Myrna time to actually get back from Florida to teach it. As well, we have added an overflow class on April 14 for the fabric postcards, as the number signed up far exceeds what can be managed in one class.  Susan McLeod's fabric landscape workshop has been a big hit with the guild. We had forty members attend the first of four nights. It looks like this project will keep most of us busy until spring! Note the fourth and final segment of Susan's workshop was rescheduled to April 14.

# Red Lentil Mulligatawny

1 cup red lentils, rinsed 4to5 cups vegetable broth

1 tbsp oil 1 medium onion, diced

2 cloves garlic, minced 1½ tsp minced ginger

1 large tomato, diced or I cup canned diced tomato

 $1\,\%$  tsp curry powder

1 ½ tsp ground cumin

½ tsp garam masala

1 tsp salt

2 potatoes, peeled and diced

3 carrots, peeled and diced

½ cup golden raisins

2 apples, diced

- 1. Saute onion, garlic and ginger in oil for 5 10 minutes
- 2. Add lentils, broth, tomato and spices (not salt). Simmer about 30 minutes.
- 3. Add potatoes, carrots and salt. Simmer until vegetables are almost cooked (about 20 minutes).
- 4. Add raisins and apple and simmer until vegetables are cooked and apple has partly softened.
- 5. Serve over cooked rice or as is.

Time is flying by and before we realize it,
Quilt on the Rocks will be upon us. With this in mind, I
have been setting aside quilts for our display at Quilt
on the Rocks (with permission of the donor). The
Cuddle Quilt Committee would like to showcase our
community involvement and the type of quilts, mini
quilts and placemats that are donated to various
community organizations. Also, we would like to show
examples of our "Cuddle Quilt Saturday" work. If you
have a quilt you would like to donate and would like it
displayed at Quilt on the Rocks, please let us know
your wishes. All display quilts will be distributed after
the show.

Many have good intentions of making cuddle quilts, taking material, panels, batting and backing or tops from the cupboard. If you have cuddle quilt items, and find that you no longer can make that cuddle quilt or two that you intended, could you please return the items to the cuddle quilt committee for use by others.

Our newest project is the cross stitched two panel quilt top. Members can borrow the tops for a period of up to two weeks. During that time, you can work on any part of the top that interests you. Flowers can be stitched in any DMC colours provided by the stitcher, while the green stitches use the DMC floss supplied with the panel. At present, one panel has some flowers and a large amount of green cross stitched, while the other panel has a flower cross stitched.

We had a most enjoyable Cuddle Quilt Saturday, on January 10<sup>th</sup>. Twenty-nine members participated during the day, working on the 3 squared - one step to the right pattern, the crazy quilt pattern, or a cuddle quilt project of their own. Daintry gave an excellent presentation and demonstration on how to quilt smaller panels and then join the sections to make a larger quilt. Many ladies couldn't wait to try this. We look forward to the results in the very near future. The next Cuddle Quilt Saturday is February 28<sup>th</sup> from 9am-3pm.

Our quilt intake on January 20<sup>th</sup> was quite overwhelming. Thirty four quilts were passed in, with two ladies making large donations. Deanna donated 9 quilts and 4 mini memory quilts, and Agnes donated 12 quilts. The total number of quilts donated to date is 133.

Since our last Newsletter article, quilts, mini memory quilts, placemats, quilting services, cross stitching, fabric, squares, strips, and thread have been donated. We would like to thank Sandra

It's a book from my personal library, but it is available here at the Guild's Library.

Who will be the lucky member to win this beautiful quilt at the year-end banquet in May? Let me emphasize that your chances get better the more you work on the quilt. For every ½ hour of quilting that you do, you get a chance for your name to be drawn. Please don't forget to sign the log book (a black binder located on a table near the quilt); indicate your full name and the number of hours worked for the evening. For example, if you quilted for 1 ½ hours, your name gets submitted three times.

I would also like to encourage every member to participate, whether you are a beginner or are more experienced. If you've never tried hand quilting but want to, what better opportunity! It would be my pleasure to show you or to find a fellow quilter to help you. The key is to practice practice practice! The quilt will be set up every week no later than 6:30 p.m. and will be set up until at least 9 p.m. The members have the chance to put in a quick ½ hour before the meeting, and also to stay and chat a little longer afterwards.

# Patti's Hand Piecing Class


On the  $24^{th}$  of Feb I will be doing a hand piecing class. In an effort to have a class that ends up



with something useful this time, we will be making a pin cushion out of hexagons as shown in the photo here. I will bring the example to guild with me for the next couple of weeks. It really isn't as difficult as it may look. If you

aren't up to doing a pincushion, the finished hexagon sides would make a lovely embellishment for a blouse.

For anyone that has already taken the basics of hand piecing and are up for a little adventure, you



may want to have a look at a sample piece that I made up that uses the applecore shape. The finished piece comes out big enough to use as a pot holder, or with the addition of a narrow border, a mini memory quilt could be made

with it for the Hospice project. I will need to know before hand which project you prefer so that I can make up the kits. In the photo here, you can see the print apple core in the center surrounded by 8 more apple cores in the lighter colour. Long half and short half apple core pieces are used to finish the outside edge. Kits for each project will be \$2.00.

#### Quilts on the Rocks 2009

Our 2009 show is coming fast, and now it is time for the members to prepare their entries for Quilts on the Rocks. <u>Please keep this information handy for future reference.</u>

# General Rules:

 to enter a piece in the show, you must be a paid up member for the 2008/2009 guild year, and your membership for 2009/2010 must be paid before Quilts on the Rocks to be held on October 2, and 3, 2009.

- If you are entering a piece in Stitchery or Quilting, or items for the Boutique, you must be available to work a 2 hour shift. Life members are excluded from this provision, but are encouraged to attend, and first choice of shifts and location is available to them. All staff must wear a QOR chatelaine, collar or apron. If you do not have one, we will be providing a workshop and kit-check Program for date.
- You must complete and submit the appropriate form- Quilting or Stitchery, or both, by the last guild meeting this year. Each item must have a separate form, along with a photo of the item. If you do not have a photo, please bring your item to guild and our Historian will take one for you. The photo will be available at our regular guild meeting the following week.
- I tems for Display must not have been included in any previous Quilts on the Rocks (except the antique display of stitchery)
- Forms for the Boutique will be available, and are to be submitted at the time of the show along with your items for sale. If you have items for sale that will be displayed in Quilts on the Rocks, please indicate this on the Display Forms as well. Boutique forms and tags will also be available in September.
- Display items must be delivered to the Parkside Center before set up and picked up on take down of the show. Times and dates will be provided in September.
- If you have your own display equipment for the piece, please indicate this on the form, and tag the display equipment with your name and phone number.
- All quilted items that are to be hung must have a 4" sleeve attached to the back.
- All items on display will be accompanied by an Artist Statement which must be provided with the appropriate display form. This is where you

tell the viewers what technique and pattern was used, where the idea for your piece came from, and any other information that will be of value to the viewers. If your piece is an original design, please indicate this as well.

Stitchery forms are to be submitted to Juliet McDonald. Quilting forms are to be submitted to Mary Roy or Barbara Lipic. All forms can also be submitted to Daintry Chitaroni and Susan Young.

Cathy Carr will begin the sign up for the various shifts on our return to guild in September.

Carla Alexiuk and Jan Bayly will hand out Boutique forms and tags both in the spring and in September before the show.

Liz Kivistik will have show tickets for anyone who would like to purchase tickets in advance, or to give as gifts to friends and family. Entry fee is \$5.

Bookmarks, flyers and posters will be available for those who are traveling and would like to distribute them over the summer. They can be obtained from Val Letford and Sandra Desormeaux, or from the Convenors.

### Quilts on the Rocks Awards

Quilts on the Rocks is a venue that allows the members of the Sudbury and District Quilting and Stitchery guild to display their work for the enjoyment of the community. It is a celebration of three years of productivity and pride in our chosen artistic pursuits. We hope to display samples of all of the needlework arts.

In the case of Quilting, we are looking for bed quilts, wall quilts, clothing, décor pieces, Christmas quilted items, and any other item that qualifies as a quilt (3 layers, stitched together). Quilting can be done by hand, by domestic machine or by long arm. At this time we are limiting large quilts to 2 per person until we determine our space allocations. There are no limits on any other quilted items.

For Stitchery, we hope to display all forms-cross stitch, hardanger, beading, blackwork, goldwork, samplers, petitpoint, redwork, embroidery, silk ribbon,

or anything else that qualifies as stitchery. Stitched items that are also quilted should be entered as Quilt Display. We hope to also display a grouping of Antique Stitchery pieces and gadgets, and forms for these items will also be required. There are no limits to the number of stitchery pieces entered.

Though a small number of awards will be offered there will not be any ribbons on the pieces during the show. Cash awards and ribbons will be presented at the first guild meeting after Quilts on the Rocks 2009. By doing this, we hope to encourage all members to submit their recent work regardless of experience and technical abilities. The show is for the benefit of the community as a whole, as an expression of what we do as a group.

Awards will be presented as follows:

# Peer Recognition Awards

When you drop off your items for the show, you will be provided with a form to document your choice for the piece that you feel is deserving of this award. Peer Recognition allows our members to vote for the piece that they feel is an outstanding example of a members' workmanship, design and construction in both Quilting, and Stitchery categories. Voting for this award is limited to our guild members who are participating in Quilts on the Rocks, and our Life Members. Life members will be provided with a form when they attend. Quilted items eligible for the Peer Recognition Awards are limited to those that have been made entirely by the one person.

This form also includes your choice for the following Awards held in trust by the QOR committee:

#### - Lila Christine Conroy Award for Novice Quilter

o This award is sponsored by Mary Conroy, the founder and Life Member of our guild. The award is granted to a person new to the quilting experience (since the last show). Eligible pieces will be colour coded. If you are new to quilting, please be sure to indicate this on your intake form.

#### -Vena Mietens Award for Original Stitchery

-This award is sponsored by Vena Mietens, a Life Member of our guild and accomplished stitchery artist. The award has been ongoing for many years to encourage our members to produce original works. Her criteria is as follows: "The entries should be judged from purely artistic viewpoint, from purely stitchery perfection angle and then just by the aesthetic impact". Eligible pieces will be colour coded. If your stitchery piece is an original design, please be sure to indicate this on your intake form.

Also available will be the **Simone Landry Award for Hand Quilting**. This sponsored award will be chosen by the family.

**Viewers Choice** ballots will be provided at the door to paying viewers, to our members staffing the show, our merchants and Life Members. This is the opportunity for the community at large to vote for their favorite piece of Quilting and of Stitchery.

Other sponsored awards may also be available.

We hope that all of our members will participate in displaying their work for the enjoyment of the community and that our 2009 show will be a sampling of the variety and talents of the Sudbury and District Quilting & Stitchery Guild.
