

Quilts on the Rocks 2009 Proposed guidelines for <u>quilted items</u> and eligibility for awards

Quilts on the Rocks awards for quilted items include: Peer Recognition Awards Simone Landry Award for Hand Quilting Viewer's Choice Novice Quilting Award Country Quilter Award

I would like to propose to the guild and to the Quilts on the Rocks committee that the **Peer**Recognition Awards and the Novice Quilter Awards be limited to the following entries:

Quilts and quilted entries that have been made entirely by the member submitting the item into the show. That is that the top is pieced, appliquéd, stitched or otherwise constructed using any technique, solely by the member submitting the quilt. The final product must also be quilted by that member, either by machine, by hand or long-arm quilted by that same member.

Both of the above awards are in recognition of outstanding work by a member. They are not meant to apply solely to the piece itself. By encouraging our members to quilt their own quilts and take pride in their work, the members obtain the knowledge required to finish the job. Otherwise we would be called the Topper Sewing group, not Quilters.

This proposal came about due to the large number of quilts being sent out to be long-arm quilted instead of being finished by the members. If you walk through any show – be it Rayside-Balfour, North Bay or our last show, the majority of the pieces include a line Quilted by.....(insert long arm quilter's name here). I understand that time limitations, physical constraints and other situations come up that don't allow our members to do the actual quilting, and we do want to include these lovely pieces in the show. However for the purpose of the above awards, I feel it is important that those members who take the time to make their quilt in its entirety take priority when it comes to Recognition awards.

I welcome your comments and discussion <u>in</u> <u>writing</u> so that I can take your opinions to the Quilts on the Rocks Committee for a final decision.

It also offers referral and treatment to the target population and their partners. The treatment team is comprised of a nurse clinician, a social worker and a psychiatrist. The Program operates out of the Mental Health & Addiction Services of the Regional Hospital and is located at 127 Cedar Street, Sudbury.

Interesting Info from CQA

May 5th, 2008

Dear Member Guild,

Recently, the Board of Directors has been made aware of the circulation of misinformation

concerning the CQA/ACC National Juried Show (NJS) and on behalf of the Board, I would like to

take this opportunity to clarify and correct this information. During the 2008 CQA/ACC budget deliberations very tough

financial decisions had to be made by

the Board. One decision was to delete the NJS awards sponsored by the Association,

Excellence in Workmanship Awards for both Appliqué and Piecing, unless sponsors could be

obtained to fund these awards.

The Board of Directors continued to search for new sponsors, both corporate and individuals.

Through this process the Added Purse Donation Campaign was carried out within the

Association. We were pleased with our member guilds' enthusiastic support to our call for

donations to support their Association. And in the Spring 2008 issue of *The Canadian*

Quilter, which was circulated in February, we were delighted to inform the membership that

through generous Added Purse donations from our member guilds we had received sufficient

funds to reinstate the awards for Excellence in

Workmanship, both Appliqué and Piecing,

effective 2008. [See page 30, Added Purse Donations.] Both contemporary and traditional works are honoured at the annual NJS with awards of equal

value. It is also the case that both contemporary and traditional works are equally eligible for the

exceptional awards - Best of Show, Machine Quilting, Hand Quilting, Judge's Choice, Viewer's

Choice, Excellence for Work by a First Time Exhibitor in the NJS, and the Awards for Excellence

in Workmanship: Appliqué and Piecing. The Board has also equalized the award money

presented to award winners in the Traditional categories, as was evident at the 2007 NJS, the $\,$

2008 NJS and this will also be the case for 2009.

As the Board continues to listen to our members, further revisions to the National Juried Show will

occur. The summer 2008 issue of *The Canadian Quilter* will carry an article called "2009 National"

Juried Show (NJS) Call for Entry – Revisions are Ongoing."
It will introduce a new category for

traditional Wallquilts, that being Traditional Wallquilts made from published patterns and books.

The Traditional Wallquilts category that has been in place will be renamed Traditional Wallquilts –

Original Interpretation. The inclusion of this new category has been in direct response to member

feedback and financial support in regards to traditional quilting.

Excepting the new category for 2009, both contemporary and traditional works are required to demonstrate original interpretation. We have every

confidence in the skills and expertise of the

judges selected to make the decisions for the awards of the CQA/ACC National Juried Show. As

the National Juried Show continues to evolve, it is our hope to see a greater interest from

traditional quilters entering their works at the national level. The Board continues to look for feedback and support from our members as we carry out the aims and objectives of our Association.
