

# First Baptist Will Observe Kentucky Day

**Choir to Give Cantata;  
Discussion of Russia  
at Metropolitan.**

Luther Rice, the 100th anniversary of whose death will be celebrated by Washington churchmen next summer, will be the subject of tomorrow morning's sermon at First Baptist Church, Sixteenth and O streets northwest.

Dr. Rufus W. Weaver, pastor, will occupy the pulpit, and has entitled his sermon, "Luther Rice, a Study in Frustration."

Kentucky Day will be observed also at the service. Washington residents from that State being especially invited.

The Lenten cantata, "Penitence, Pardon and Peace," by Maunder, will be presented by the choir, directed by Raymond Rapp, at the evening service.

In the evening a special service is planned to center around the discussion of "Conditions in Russia and the Dangers of Communism."
