
English-Austrian Picnic - May 18, 2004

Obituary: Marika Roekk

Beloved operetta star Marika Roekk died May 16 in Baden near Vienna. She was born to Hungarian parents in Cairo, and grew up in Budapest, but she was Austria's darling for her famous appearances in Kalman's operettas, especially *Graefin Maritza* and *Czardas Fuerstin*. She performed on the musical stage and in films throughout Europe and the United States. She was 90 years old.

There are 21 designs from the Austrian favorite "Rippled Green", to the more contemporary "Waterfall" and "Rainbow" designs. The company's linen collection of handmade



tablecloths, runners and accents compliments the tableware. The 'Blaudruck' (blue print) items come from Bad Leonfelden in Upper Austria using a technique similar to batik.
