In October, Elfriede Jelinek, born in 1946 in the town of Mürzzuschlag in the Austrian province of Styria, was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature. One of her novels, The Piano Teacher, was made into a film starring Isabelle Huppert. The film won three top prizes at Cannes in 2001.

Ambassador Eva Nowotny graced us with her kind words regarding the past accomplishments and the future of the Society.
