The **PFMC** sets up pilgrimages, retreats, conferences, days of recollection, healing services, Bible Study, prayer meetings, etc. It has a rosary making program and a ministry to priests and other religious. It produces an evangelistic periodical "**The PILGRIM**" providing additional information on the ministry. The **PFMC** has operated under priest spiritual direction, within the several dioceses of the **Delaware Valley**, since **1989**. We invoke the **Gifts of the Holy Spirit**, **Marian Messages**, and **Eucharistic Adoration**. We are an all-volunteer ministry and welcome helping hands on a daily, weekly or monthly schedule. Through the intercession of Our Lady, each year the volunteers work very hard as instruments of the Holy Trinity, especially Our Lord, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, to put together a beautiful RC, YT, and 3DX. We have set up this 2005 RC, YT, and 3DX in a SILENT RETREAT FORMAT, asking that each person give himself or herself a chance to BE STILL AND KNOW THAT HE WANTS TO SPEAK WITHIN EACH OF YOU. This weekend give yourself the freedom to pray and absorb each presentation in a RETREAT setting. Therefore we are stressing SILENCE in as many areas of the hotel that we can between the talks. It is the only way to listen and to absorb all that is being taught.

Many have seen this time as a weekend to slip away from the busy world and to rest in the arms of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, to embrace the word, the Lamb of God, and to find His wisdom and healing in their lives. Therefore we ask you out of respect for yourselves and for the persons next to you that you practice silence as much as possible. Please go to talk ONLY in those areas where SILENCE is not expected.

We welcome you this year, and thank you for your "yes" to this **2005 PRE-LENTEN RC, YT,** and **3DX**. During this **RC, YT,** and **3DX** all of our volunteers will be praying for you and for your intentions. They will be available to help you, to pray with you, or to answer any questions. We ask that you pray for each of us. We thank the excellent speakers for coming and sharing the wealth of God's knowledge and healing prayer with us. We hope that you will leave with great joy and peace, and with a true anticipation and sense of the Path to Heaven that must be embraced by all.

Pilgrims of Faith Marian Center (PFMC), A Religious Association, Inc. PLACES TO TALK - TO BE SILENT

Talking is allowed in the **Main Lobby**, in **Cooper's Bar and Bistro**, and during the **Hot Lunches** in the **Terrace Room** or the **Riverside Ballroom**.

SILENCE is to be respected around the displays in the **Crystal Ballroom**, and display areas outside the **Grand Ballroom** in the **Promenade** and **Foyer** areas, and around the guest hotel rooms. Please be especially quiet around the **ADORATION ROOM** (**Room 923**). There is to be absolute silence around the **Confession Rooms** on the 9th **Floor**. Many use this time as a time of reflection and prayer. We want to have an atmosphere where listening to God can be achieved. It is extremely inconsiderate to carry on conversations in the **Confessional** and **ADORATION ROOM** (**Room 923**) areas.

If someone is disturbing you, **please** be kind and make a gesture of **silence.** If you are the one speaking, we ask that this gesture be taken as a gentle reminder and that you will be kind and respectful and go to the areas listed above to talk. **Enjoy the SILENCE!!!**

ADORATION ROOM (Room 923)

Please make every effort to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in the *Adoration Room (Room 923)* during this RC and 3DX. "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?" [Mat 26:40] "Could you not keep watch for one hour?" [Mark 14:37]

Please sign up for an hour of Adoration during *Friday* or *Saturday* night of the **RC** and **YT** as well as *Monday* or *Tuesday* night of the **3DX** so that we know there are at least two people scheduled to be with Him every hour. Enjoy listening to Him in the **silence** of the night. Quietly leave your room, in comfortable clothes, and come to the *Adoration Room* at any time during the night.

The **Adoration Room (Room 923)** will be open after the **Holy Mass** on **Friday** night until the closing **Procession for Adoration and Benediction** in the **Grand Ballroom** on **Sunday** except during **Holy Mass** and from about **7:15 PM** until about **10 PM** on **Saturday** to allow everyone to listen to the talk and Concert as well as participate in the Healing Service.

SACRAMENT of CONFESSION, PENANCE, or RECONCILIATION

Hotel rooms **920** and **924** on the **9th Floor** have been designated as **Confessionals**. You may either face the priest or sit behind him. These **Confessional Rooms 920** and **924** are situated across from the **Adoration Room, Room 923**. There may be extra priests hearing **Confessions** in the **Priest's Room** or **Sacristy, Plaza VI**, where they will be separated by dividers. Tags have been placed on the doors or dividers to designate if a priest is available in a specific room or **Confessional** area.

We encourage you to use the **Adoration Room** in preparation for and following your **Confession**.

There will be a limited number of chairs in the hallway for those fully prepared for **Confession**. Use a "buddy" system to have people coming back from **Confession** to alert you that space is available on the chairs. We encourage brief **Confessions** without asking for deep **Spiritual Direction** due to the number of attendees who will be seeking to receive the **Sacrament** of **Confession / Penance / Reconciliation**.

We have asked that priests be available on *Friday* (for those who want to get a "Jump Start" on grace). They will also be available from about *9 AM Saturday* through the day and until the time of the **Concert / Healing Service** *Saturday evening*. We are limited in the number of priests for **Confession**, and ask you to be considerate of their needs to eat and take an occasional break. They should turn the signs on their doors when they leave so that you will know that there is no priest in that room.

Because of requirements for priests in their parishes on *Sunday*, there will only be a few priests available for **Confession** on *Sunday*.

At all times please remember that there are many who wish to receive the graces from this beautiful Sacrament. It is respectful to others if you do not use this Confession time for deep Spiritual Direction. Please try to make an appointment at another time for seeing a priest for personal matters requiring a lot of time.

We are very grateful to all of the priests who have so generously come to help us with this beautiful **Sacrament** of **Confession**, **Penance**, or **Reconciliation** as well as the graces that flow from it.

OTHER MINISTRIES / VENDORS

The **PFMC** has a large assortment of spiritual books, tapes, and religious articles available for your perusal in the **Crystal Ballroom** across the **Crystal Foyer** from the **Grand Ballroom**. Stop by and take a look. Everything is marked with the level of donation requested. You may donate for extra items, give them as gifts, and take a charitable donation on your income taxes. This material is displayed at the **PFMC**, **61 Cooper Road**, **Voorhees**, **NJ 08043-4963** when it is not on the road.

All displays of other ministries and vendors will be found in the **Crystal Foyer** or in the **Crystal Promenade**, the long hallway outside of the **Grand Ballroom** behind the seating area.

We have asked the volunteers in ministry and the vendors to close their displays at the call to gather in the **Grand Ballroom**. for each talk. Most of the time this will be music played by the music ministry, i.e. **REFUGE** for the **RC**, or **Stephen and Sandy Garchar** for the **3DX**. Most of the volunteers in ministry and the vendors wish to hear the presentations, seminars, workshops, etc. Be respectful of their desire to be silent and listen to the speakers.

There is adequate time before the beginning of the **RC** and during the breaks between the sessions, particularly during the **3DX**, for you to visit when all of the displays are open. Most of the displays will remain open during meal hours by the sharing of meal times amongst those who are in charge of the displays.

We have provided a list of ministries, organizations, and vendors who have pre-registered with requests for display tables as well as a listing of the hours that the **PFMC** displays will be open. You will find this information on pages 19 through 21. Please patronize them at the home locations after the **RC**.

The **PFMC**, and many of the other ministries, operate on donations with individuals being responsible for determining value received in return for the donation. The **PFMC** materials are all marked for estimated value or requested donation.

HOT LUNCH with the SPEAKERS

There is a hot lunch to be held either in the **Terrace Room** or the **Riverside Ballroom** at **NOON** on **Saturday** with speakers and **PFMC** volunteers seated at tables with **RC** attendees. Please note the maps of the inside of the **HILTON HOTEL** as well as the area around it on the centerfold pages 22 and 23.

If you wish to donate for the luncheon at \$20 per person for a full hot buffet meal and to sit and enjoy your meal with the speakers, we ask you to go to the **Registration Area** outside the **Grand Ballroom** before the **RC** begins or prior to 10 AM Saturday morning.

There are only a limited number of hot lunch seats (200) available and we must have a count for meals by 10 AM Saturday morning.

Pilgrims of Faith Marian Center (PFMC), A Religious Association, Inc. MEALS INSIDE the HILTON HOTEL

The HILTON HOTEL Restaurant "Cooper's Bar and Bistro" will be open at 6:30 AM on Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in order to accommodate the needs of each attendee. Buffets will be set up for each meal in order to expedite service. There is also a menu for each of the meals from which you may order to your desires. Some mealtimes will have special limited menus in an effort to expedite service for the RC and 3DX attendees. The Hilton Hotel will also provide snacks, and drinks (coffee bar) area just inside the door of "Cooper's Bar and Bistro" to the right for snacks and drinks during the RC. Since there is free coffee in each room, we have not arranged for a free hotel coffee bar for all attendees. There are water stations in the Grand Ballroom.

The *PFMC* has arranged for pre-paid hot lunches in either the **Terrace Room** or **Riverside Ballroom** serving hot food from a self-service line on *Sunday, Monday, Tuesday*, or *Wednesday*. We are asking a \$20 donation per hot lunch and must have meal counts to the hotel management no later than 10 AM for each day. We have a large percentage of the attendees joining us for pre-paid hot lunches. If you would like to sign up and have not, please see the *PFMC* **Registration Desk, Edwina Jardinico**, prior to 10 AM on the day you wish to join us for a hot lunch.

3DX HOT LUNCHES

For the **3DX**, the *PFMC* is collecting donations of \$20 per person or \$60 for the three days to provide pre-paid hot lunches in either the **Terrace Room** or **Riverside Ballroom** on *Monday, Tuesday*, or *Wednesday*. Please purchase hot lunch tickets at the *PFMC* **Registration Desk** only up to 10 AM on the day of the meal.

Please come and enjoy your meals in the *Hilton Hotel*. Stay inside and warm. The staff servers are wonderful, the food well planned and we welcome our **3DX** attendees.

MEALS OUTSIDE the HILTON HOTEL

Other places for meals are available nearby. Many are listed in this **RC** and **3DX** booklet. There is a listing showing their locations and approximate distances from the *HILTON HOTEL* on pages 27 and 28. There are many of the national "fast food" outlets nearby. **New Jersey** is known for its "Diner" services and most have great food. Be careful about some of the restaurants with "cuisine" in their names as they are fine dining establishments and may not offer the turn-around needed to get back for **RC** and **3DX** events in time for the next speaker.

If you have further questions concerning local directions and eating establishments, please check at the *HILTON HOTEL* Reception / Registration Desk.

AUDIO TAPING

Audio Taping is being done on site for the **RC** and **3DX**. It is directed by **Robert Pladek** of *CATHOLIC FOCUS*, an Audio / Video / Duplication Service at 177 Ballantine Road, **Middletown**, **NJ**.

All tapes will be available at \$6 each at the conference. An order sheet is in your packet and can be used for ordering at the **RC** and **3DX** or by mail. Note that package deals are available for sets of tapes for either or both of the **RC** and **3DX**.

If there is a talk that is especially good and you want someone who has been unable to be hear it, get them a tape as a little remembrance.

We encourage you to get a set of the talks for yourself to help you following the **RC** and **3DX**. No one can hold in everything that is said during the **RC** and **3DX**, and it is so important to be able to re-listen to the presentations over the next year and grow from them.

CHECK OUT TIME and BAGGAGE / LUGGAGE

HILTON HOTEL CHECK OUT TIME is at 12 NOON Sunday or Wednesday. If you require a later check out, please call the **HILTON HOTEL** Reception / Registration Desk to make arrangements.

There is a baggage / luggage storage area which may be used should you not be able to take your things to your car prior to *NOON*. You may arrange with the *HILTON HOTEL* Reception / Registration **Desk** to have your baggage / luggage picked up and placed in storage prior to *NOON*. Be sure it is well tagged. The storage area is secured.

HELP NEEDED

At the close of the **3DX** on **WEDNESDAY** afternoon, we will be in need of persons who would help us pack up the **PFMC** books, tapes and religious articles from the **PFMC** area in the **Crystal Ballroom**. We need to have care in this process so that the materials get back into their designated storage containers. Speed is not the issue here because "haste makes waste" for the volunteers in getting the **PFMC** back to normal operations when the materials are returned to storage.

Report to **Vince** and **Livia Nocella**, who are in charge of the **PFMC** storage and display rooms. They will provide guidance on the re-packing of material. Once the storage bins are packed, we need help to remove them to the truck at the back loading dock.

Extra hands, over and above those who are re-packing the storage bins, are needed to work with **Keith Werner** and other **PFMC** volunteers. We need help to move materials brought into the **Adoration Room, Hospitality Rooms,** and the **Grand Ballroom** to the truck or to cars / vans at the back loading area outside the **Crystal Foyer** entrance.

If you can give us a hand following the closing ceremonies, please inform one of the volunteers mentioned above or any of the **PFMC** staff.

We also need a dozen or so people to follow the truck to the **PFMC** in **Voorhees** and quickly get it emptied out into the garage area. Please, we beg for this help as we must return the rental truck and get the vans emptied. We can use everyone's hands.

Ladies, if your husband, or son or any male relative can come on **WEDNESDAY** afternoon but was not able to attend the **RC** or **3DX**, please encourage them to come and help. There is always a movement of the Holy Spirit in those who are helping us pack up and return material to the **PFMC**. We appreciate all the help possible.


Cenacles, Eucharistic Ministers, and in evangelization in various neighboring parishes.

Father Bill attended Immaculate Conception Seminary in Mahwah, NJ. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Newark on *October 30, 1982*. Presently, he is pastor of *Saint Antoninus* Church, Newark, NJ, a spirit-filled charismatic parish. Father Bill has been in the Charismatic Renewal since 1975 and is a much sort after bible teacher. He has been a guest speaker at National Charismatic Conferences in Los

Angles, Pittsburgh, New Jersey, Denver, Florida, New Hampshire and Idaho. He was ordained a priest for the **Diocese of Catarman** on *March 11*, *1979*. We will give him special honors prior to his

Holy Mass and at the **Hot Lunch with Speakers** on *Saturday* in recognition of his **25 years as a Roman Catholic Priest**. If you would like to honor him by joining us at the **Hot Lunch with Speakers** on *Saturday*, make sure you are signed up for this prior to *10 AM* on *Saturday*. The Eucharistic mandate of Jesus: "Do This In Memory of Me" is central to his life of ministry with the poor.

Father Mike's first hand experience of war, poverty and hunger of children and the poor led him to inspire and motivate those who have "a heart for the poor" to live out this eucharistic mandate. The fruit of this eucharistic contemplation was the establishment of a ministry of compassion in *1990*, the *World of Hope Foundation, Inc.*, a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit charitable organization ministering with the poor and children international. The New York, Louisiana, Pennsylvania and California corporate communities administer its sponsorship, grant and volunteer programs in India, Bosnia-Hercegovina, Mexico, India and the Philippines.

Father Mike is affectionately called the "Singing Priest." He uses his music ministry at parish missions, Marian Conferences, Eucharistic celebrations, healing services and praise and worship concerts. His talents as an accomplished singer/songwriter and speaker have enabled him to carry out his ministry in most major **U.S**. cities as well as various **European** and **Asian** countries.

He has 2 music videos and 12 music albums including a newly released Jubilee CD entitled "We Are The Church, God's Family: Sign Of Hope." Father Mike produces his music materials to help raise the awareness of the public to the plight of the poor and raise funds for their needs through the World of Hope Foundation. Music is an integral part of Father Mike, giving a unique flavor to the parish mission, retreat-conferences, parish musical presentations and healing services her conducts.

Father Mike is officially assigned by his Bishop as representative for the Mission Cooperation Plan for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith. With his Bishop's approval, Father Mike continues to assist the World of Hope Foundation as its current National President and Executive Officer.







About the Angelus

Angelus Domini -- Excerpts From Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy, Principles and Guidelines on the Vatican Website.

195. The *Angelus Domini* is the traditional form used by the faithful to commemorate the holy annunciation of the angel Gabriel to Mary. It is used three times daily: at dawn, mid-day and at dusk. It is a recollection of the salvific event in which the Word became flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary, through the power of the Holy Spirit in accordance with the salvific plan of the Father.

The recitation of the *Angelus* is deeply rooted in the piety of the Christian faithful, and strengthened by the example of the Roman Pontiffs. In some places changed social conditions hinder its recitation, but in many other parts every effort should be made to maintain and promote this pious custom and at least the recitation of three *Aves*. The *Angelus* "over the centuries has conserved its value and freshness with its simple structure, biblical character [...] quasi liturgical rhythm by which the various time of the day are sanctified, and by its openness to the Paschal Mystery" (231).

It is therefore "desirable that on some occasions, especially in religious communities, in shrines dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, and at meetings or conventions, the *Angelus* be solemnly recited by singing the *Ave Maria*, proclaiming the Gospel of the Annunciation" (232) and by the ringing of bells.

History of the Angelus

The *Angelus* is a short devotion in honor of the Incarnation, repeated three times each day, morning, noon, and evening, at the sound of the bell. It consists essentially in the triple repetition of the "Hail Mary", to which in later times have been added three introductory versicles, and a concluding versicle and prayer.

During the Easter season, the <u>Regina Coeli (Queen of Heaven)</u> replaces the usual arrangement of the *Angelus* prayers. The <u>Salve Regina (Hail, Holy Queen)</u> is often recited as the concluding prayer.

The devotion derives its name from the first word of the three versicles, *Angelus Domini nuntiavit Mariæ* (The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary).

The origins of the *Angelus* are somewhat obscure, but it seems clear they are rooted in monastic prayers of the hours, and even in its earliest form included the three "Hail Marys". Originally the *Angelus* prayers were said at *Complin* (night prayer), and over the years mid-day and morning hours were added. By the early seventeenth century the formula of prayers exactly as we know it today was complete.

The Angelus Bells

The triple "Hail Mary" was closely associated with the ringing of a bell, a practice apparently derived from the monastic tradition of *Complin*. The three interrupted peals of the *Ave* bell probably served as an introduction to the continuous tolling of the curfew that preceded *Matins* (morning prayer).

The manner of ringing the *Angelus* -- the triple stroke repeated three times, with a pause between each set of three (a total of nine strokes), which might be followed by a longer peal as at curfew -- seems to have been in place from the very beginning. In the fifteenth-century constitutions of Syon monastery, it is directed that the lay brother "shall toll the *Ave* bell nine strokes at three times, keeping the space of one *Pater* and *Ave* between each three tollings".

Bells dedicated to the *Angelus* can be found throughout Europe -- inscriptions include: *Ave Maria and O Rex Gloriæ Veni Cum Pace* (O King of Glory, Come with Peace). A number of European *Angelus* bells are dedicated to Saint Gabriel, with inscriptions including: *Dulcis instar mellis campana vecor Gabrielis* (I am sweet as honey, and am called Gabriel's bell) and *Missus vero pie Gabriel fert læta Mariæ* (Gabriel the messenger bears joyous tidings to holy Mary.)

A fifteenth-century bell at Erfert bears the words: *Cum ter reboo, pie Christiferam ter aveto* (When I ring thrice, thrice devoutly greet the Mother of Christ). Though the practice of saying the *Angelus* declined in the latter half of the twentieth century, many parishes continue the tradition of ringing the *Angelus* bells, traditionally at 6:00 a.m., noon and 6:00 p.m.

THE DIVINE MERCY NOVENA



Jesus further asked that the **Feast of the Divine Mercy** on the **Sunday after Easter** be preceded by a **Novena to the Divine Mercy** beginning on **Good Friday**.

He gave *Saint Faustina* an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, Saint Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the Novena are:

DAY 1 - All mankind, especially sinners

DAY 2 - The souls of priests and religious

<u>DAY 3</u> - All devout and faithful souls

DAY 4 - Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him

<u>DAY 5</u> - The souls of separated brethren

<u>DAY 6</u> - The meek and humble souls and the souls of children

<u>DAY 7</u> - The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy

<u>DAY 8</u> - The souls who are detained in purgatory; and

DAY 9 - The souls who have become lukewarm.

The Novena prayers are prayed along with the **Divine Mercy Chaplet** on each day of the **Novena**.

Please notify the *PFMC* before 25 February 2005 if your parish or prayer group is going to honor Our Lord Jesus Christ through the Divine Mercy Novena in 2005.

We will publish a notice of all Divine Mercy Novena celebrations we are aware of in the February – March issue of "The PILGRIM" sent out in early March 2005.

First Day (Good Friday):

Today bring Me all mankind, especially all sinners.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins, but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His Sorrowful Passion show us Your mercy, that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy for ever and ever. Amen.

Second Day (Holy Saturday or Easter Vigil):

Today Bring Me the Souls of Priests and Religious.

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in us, that we may perform worthy works of mercy, and that all who see us may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company [of chosen souls] in Your vineyard - upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation, and with one voice sing praise to Your boundless mercy for ages without end. Amen.

Third Day (Easter Sunday):

Today Bring Me All Devout and Faithful Souls.

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in the great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by that most wondrous love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely. Eternal Father, turn Your Merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His Sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Fourth Day (Easter Monday):

Today Bring Me Those Who Do Not Believe In Me and Those Who Do Not Know Me

Most Compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who as yet do not believe in You or do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in Your Son, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Pilgrims of Faith Marian Center (PFMC), A Religious Association, Inc. Fifth Day (Easter Tuesday):

Today Bring to Me the Souls of the Separated Brethren

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of our separated brethren. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of our separated brethren, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your Own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Sixth Day (Easter Wednesday):

Today Bring Me the Meek and Humble Souls and the Souls of Little Children

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said, "Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart." Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy, and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweet-smelling bouquet before the throne of God; God Himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek and humble souls, and upon the souls of little children, who are enfolded in the abode of the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight you take in them: bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Seventh Day (Easter Thursday):

Today Bring Me The Souls Who Especially Venerate and Glorify My Mercy

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your Mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident in Your Mercy. These souls are united to Jesus and carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy and their spirit, overflowing with joy, sings a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them, "I Myself will defend as My own glory, during their lifetime, and especially at the hour of their death, those souls who will venerate My fathomless mercy."

Pilgrims of Faith Marian Center (PFMC), A Religious Association, Inc. Eighth Day (Easter Friday):

Today Bring Me The Souls Who Are In the Prison Of Purgatory

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You, and yet who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of purifying fire, that in that place, too, the power of Your mercy may be praised. Eternal Father, turn Your most merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg You, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded, manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way than through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion. Amen.

Ninth Day (Easter Saturday):

Today Bring Me The Souls Who Have Become Lukewarm

Most Compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love let these tepid souls, who, like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardor of Your love; and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His three- hour agony on the Cross: let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy. Amen

THE FEAST DAY OF DIVINE MERCY

In Saint Faustina's vision, Jesus also asked that the Feast of Mercy by celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. In this, our Lord is showing us the close connection between the Easter mystery of man's redemption and His Divine Mercy. The Feast of Mercy is a day of grace for all people, particularly for sinners.

Jesus attached great promises to this Feast, the greatest of which is tied in with the reception of Holy Communion. He promises complete forgiveness of sins and elimination of punishment if one approaches the Fountain of Life on the Feast of Mercy with an attitude of trust, and if one meets the other requirements that the Lord gave to Faustina. The graces are equal to the ones we receive in the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

The greatness of this Feast lies also in the fact that everyone, even those who are converted that very day, may obtain any grace for the asking, if what they ask for is compatible with God's will.

"I want this image," Jesus told Faustina, "to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy." (*Diary*, 49). "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete

forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet." (*Diary*, 699).

The preparation for this Feast is to be noven consisting of the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet for nine days, beginning on Good Friday. This noven is in the *Diary of Saint Faustina*.

THE IMAGE OF THE DIVINE MERCY



The Image of the Divine Mercy originated in a vision given to Saint Faustina on February 22, 1931. In that vision, our Lord expressed His desire to have the image painted, with the words and signature beneath reading, "Jesus, I trust in You."

The image represents the risen Christ whose hands and feet bear the marks of the crucifixion. From His pierced heart, two rays issue forth: red and pale. When asked about their meaning, Jesus explained, "The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls.... These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross" (*Diary*, 299).



In other words, these two rays signify the Sacraments of Mercy: the Eucharist and Reconciliation. It is through the Eucharist (Blood) that we obtain our nourishment, and through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Water) that we receive the cleansing of our souls. "Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter," said Jesus, "for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him" (*Diary*, 299).

The veneration of the image is based on prayer joined with deeds of mercy. He attached many promises to those who venerate the image and said, "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in you'" (*Diary*, 227). "By means of this image I shall be granting many graces to souls; so that every soul have access to it" (*Diary*, 570). "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself would defend as My own glory" (*Diary*, 48).

HOW TO PRAY THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is to be prayed, in addition to daily devotion, hourly in Eucharistic Adoration Chapels for the sick and dying.

The Chaplet may be prayed using ordinary Rosary Beads (Diary § 476). Begin the Chaplet with the following introductory prayers:

"You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us" (*Diary*, 1319)

"O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You (Diary, 187), (3 times).

Then say these prayers:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day He rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Then on the "Our Father" beads, say the following words:

"Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

On the "Hail Mary" beads, say the following words:

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

In conclusion, after the five decades, say the Concluding Doxology three times:

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

Optional Conclusion

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasure of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself (*Diary*, §950).

SELECTED DIVINE MERCY PRAYERS

3:00 - THE HOUR OF GREAT MERCY

In His revelations to Saint Faustina, Our Lord asked for special prayer and meditation on His Passion each afternoon at the three o'clock hour, the hour that recalls His death on the cross. "I remind you daughter, that as often as you hear the clock strike the third hour, immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it; invoke its omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners; for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul "(*Diary*, 1572).

It is Jesus' desire that the moment of His death on the Cross (3:00 p.m.) be venerated every day; the hour which He said was the hour of grace for the whole world – mercy triumphed over justice. At this

hour, He wants us to meditate upon His sorrowful Passion because it reveals most distinctly the love God has for His people. Also, Jesus wants us to worship and glorify the Mercy of God, and, by the merits of His Passion, to implore mercy upon ourselves and the whole world, especially for sinners.

Although it is preferable to say at least a short prayer at the Hour of Divine Mercy, for many it is not feasible to say the entire chaplet at this time. If you are unable to say the chaplet at 3:00 PM, it is acceptable to say the chaplet whenever you are able. Keep in mind that God will understand your intention, and appreciate your efforts at whatever time you are able to pray the chaplet.

Jesus instructed Sister Faustina, "My daughter, try your best to make the Stations of the Cross in this hour, provided that your duties permit it; and if you are not able to make the Stations of the Cross, then at least step into the chapel for a moment and adore, in the Blessed Sacrament, My Heart, which is full of mercy; and should you be unable to step into the chapel, immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant" (*Diary*, 1572).

This is the hour, Jesus promised, in which you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking, "In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion..." (Diary, 1320).

The Hour of Mercy is associated explicitly with three o'clock in the afternoon. Our prayers at this time should be directed to Jesus, and our petitions should appeal to the merits of His sorrowful Passion, and ask for His mercy.

Prayers at the Hour of Great Mercy

"But You Yourself, Jesus, purely out of love for us, underwent such a terrible Passion. Your Father's justice would have been propitiated with a single sigh from You, and all Your self-abasement is solely the work of Your mercy and Your inconceivable love. ... At the moment of Your death on the Cross, You bestowed upon us eternal life; allowing your most holy side to be opened, You opened an inexhaustible spring of mercy for us, giving us Your dearest possession, the Blood and Water from Your Heart. Such is the omnipotence of Your mercy. From it all grace flows to us" (*Diary*, 1747).

"O Jesus, eternal Truth, our Life, I call upon You and I beg Your mercy for poor sinners. O sweetest Heart of my Lord, full of pity and unfathomable mercy, I plead with you for poor sinners. O Most Sacred Heart, Fount of Mercy from which gush forth rays of inconceivable graces upon the entire human race, I beg of You light for poor sinners. O Jesus, be mindful of Your own bitter Passion and do not permit the loss of souls redeemed at so dear a price of Your most precious Blood" (*Diary*, 72).

"O Jesus, stretched out upon the cross, I implore You, give me the grace of doing faithfully the most holy will of Your Father, in all things, always and everywhere. And when this will of God will seem to me very harsh and difficult to fulfill, it is then I beg You, Jesus, may power and strength flow upon me from Your wounds, and may my lips keep repeating, 'Your will be done, O Lord.' O Savior of the world, Lover of man's salvation, who in such terrible torment and pain, forget Yourself to think only of the salvation of souls, O most compassionate Jesus, grant me the grace to forget myself that I may live totally for souls, helping You in the work of salvation, according to the most holy will of Your Father...." (*Diary*, 1265).

Divine Mercy, gushing forth from the bosom of the Father, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, incomprehensible mystery, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, fount gushing forth from the mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, unfathomed by any intellect, human or angelic, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, from which wells forth all life and happiness, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, better than the heavens, I trust in You.

Divine Mercy, source of miracles and wonders, I trust in You.

BENEDICTINE MEDAL and BLESSING



On the <u>face</u> of the medal is the image of <u>Saint Benedict</u>. In his right hand he holds the cross, the Christian's symbol of salvation.

Rule and Raven

In Benedict's left hand is his Rule for monastics.

On a pedestal to the right of Benedict is the <u>poisoned cup</u>, shattered when he made the sign of the cross over it. On a pedestal to the left is a raven about to carry away a loaf of poisoned bread that a jealous enemy had sent to Benedict.

C. S. P. B.

Above the cup and the raven are the Latin words: *Crux s. patris Benedicti* (The Cross of our holy father Benedict). On the margin of the medal, encircling the figure of Benedict, are the Latin words: *Eius in obitu nostro praesentia muniamur!* (May we be strengthened by his presence in the hour of our death!)

Monte Cassino

Below Benedict we read: ex SM Casino MDCCCLXXX (from holy Monte Cassino, 1880). This medal was struck to commemorate the 1400th anniversary of the birth of Saint Benedict.

Crux mihi lux



On the <u>back</u> of the medal, the cross is dominant. On the arms of the cross are the initial letters of a rhythmic Latin prayer: Crux sacra sit mihi lux! Nunquam draco sit mihi dux! (May the holy cross be my light! May the dragon never be my guide!).

Peace

Above the cross is the word PAX (peace), that has been a Benedictine motto for centuries. Around the margin of the back of the medal, the letters V R S N S M V - S M Q L I V B are the initial letters of a Latin prayer of exorcism against Satan: Vade retro Satana! Nunquam suade mihi vana!

Sunt mala quae libas. Ipse venena bibas! (Begone Satan! Never tempt me with your vanities! What you offer me is evil. Drink the poison yourself!)

Approved Blessing of the Medal of Saint Benedict

Medals of Saint Benedict may be blessed legitimately by any priest -- not necessarily a Benedictine (Instr., 26 Sept. 1964). The following English form may be used.

Our help is in the name of the Lord. Who made heaven and earth.

In the name of God the Father + almighty, who made heaven and earth, the seas and all that is in them, I exorcise these medals against the power and attacks of the evil one. May all who use these medals devoutly be blessed with health of soul and body. In the name of the Father + almighty, of the Son + Jesus Christ our Lord, and of the Holy + Spirit the Paraclete, and in the love of the same Lord Jesus Christ who will come on the last day to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire.

Amen.

Let us pray. Almighty God, the boundless source of all good things, we humbly ask that, through the intercession of Saint Benedict, you pour out your blessings + upon these medals. May those who use them devoutly and earnestly strive to perform good works be blessed by you with health of soul and body, the grace of a holy life, and remission of the temporal punishment due to sin. May they also with the help of your merciful love, resist the temptation of the evil one and strive to exercise true charity and justice toward all, so that one day they may appear sinless and holy in your sight. This we ask though Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The medals are then sprinkled with holy water.


